# **Inhaler technique**Device-specific checklists

Use these checklists to teach, check and/or confirm the way your patients use their inhalers. Check inhaler technique at every opportunity.

# Manually actuated pressurised metered-dose inhaler (pMDI)

# P

# pMDI alone



- Remove inhaler cap
- 2. Hold inhaler upright and shake well
- Breathe out slowly and gently, away from the inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- Put mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form a good seal
- Breathe in slowly through the mouth and, at the same time, press down firmly on canister
- Keep breathing in slowly and deeply and hold breath for about 5 - 10 seconds or as long as comfortable
- **7.** While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- **8.** Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- 9. If an extra dose is needed, repeat steps 2 to 8
- 10. Replace cap

# pMDI and spacer



- 1. Prepare the spacer
- 2. Remove inhaler cap
- Hold inhaler upright and shake well before inserting into spacer
- Put mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form a good seal
- Breathe out gently, into the spacer until your lungs feel empty
- **6.** Hold spacer level and press down firmly on inhaler canister once
- Single breath: Breathe in slowly and deeply and hold breath for about 5 - 10 seconds or as long as comfortable; take spacer out of mouth while holding breath
  - Tidal breath\*: Breathe in and out normally for 4 breaths before removing spacer from the mouth
- **8.** Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- 9. Remove inhaler from spacer
- **10.**If an extra dose is needed, repeat steps 3 to 9
- 11. Replace cap on inhaler

# pMDI and Haleraid



- 1. Open Haleraid and pop inhaler in
- 2. Press the inhaler in (allowing you to squeeze)
- 3. Remove inhaler cap
- 4. Hold inhaler upright and shake well
- Breathe out slowly and gently, away from the inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- Put the mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form a good seal
- Breathe in slowly through the mouth and, at the same time, squeeze firmly on the Haleraid
- 8. Keep breathing in slowly and deeply and hold breath for about 5 - 10 seconds or as long as comfortable
- While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- **10.**Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- 11. If an extra dose is needed, repeat steps 4 to 10
- 12. Replace cap

#### **Autohaler**



- Remove cap
- 2. Hold inhaler upright and shake well
- 3. Push lever up
- Breathe out slowly and gently, away from the inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- Put mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form good seal
- **6.** Breathe in slowly and deeply; keep breathing in after hearing click
- Hold breath for about 5 10 seconds or as long as comfortable
- **8.** While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- 10. Push lever down
- 11. If an extra dose is needed, repeat steps 2 to 10
- 12. Replace cap

# Soft mist inhaler (SMI)



#### Respimat




- Hold inhaler upright with the cap closed
- 2. Turn base in direction of arrows until it clicks (half a turn)
- 3. Open the cap until it snaps fully open
- Breathe out slowly and gently, away from inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- Place mouthpiece in mouth and close lips to form a good seal; do not cover air vents
- Breathe in slowly and deeply through mouth and, at the same time, press down on the dose button
- 7. Keep breathing in slowly and deeply
- **8.** Hold breath for about 5 10 seconds or as long as comfortable
- While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- 10. Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- 11. Click cap shut
- Repeat from step 1 to get the full dose (two inhalations is the usual dose for medicines used with Respimat)

**Note:** Before using for the first time, ensure cartridge is loaded into the device

#### **Accuhaler**



- 1. Open cover using thumb grip
- 2. Load dose: keep device horizontal while sliding lever until it clicks (do not shake)
- 3. Breathe out slowly and gently, away from inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- 4. Put mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form a good seal; keep inhaler horizontal
- 5. Breathe in quickly and deeply
- **6.** Hold breath for about 5 10 seconds or as long as comfortable
- 7. While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- 8. Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- 9. If more than one dose is prescribed, repeat all steps starting from step  $2^\P$

10. Close cover to click shut

### Ciphaler



- 1. Open cover using thumb grip
- 2. Load dose: keep device horizontal while sliding lever until it clicks (do not shake)
- 3. Breathe out slowly and gently, away from inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- Put mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form a good seal; keep inhaler horizontal
- 5. Breathe in quickly and deeply
- 6. Hold breath for about 5 10 seconds or as long as comfortable
- 7. While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- 8. Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- 9. If more than one dose is prescribed, repeat all steps starting from step  $2^{\P}$

10. Close cover to click shut

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# **Ellipta**



- Load dose: slide the cover down until you hear a click (do not shake)
- Breathe out slowly and gently, away from inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- Place mouthpiece between teeth and close lips to form a good seal; do not cover air vent with fingers
- 4. Breathe in quickly and deeply
- 5. Hold breath for 5 10 seconds or as long as comfortable
- 6. While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- 7. Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- 8. Slide the cover upwards as far as it will go to cover the mouthpiece
- If more than one dose is prescribed, repeat all steps starting from step 1<sup>1</sup>

**Note:** If you open and close the cover without inhaling the medicine, you will lose the dose

# General tips for inhalers

- All pMDIs should be shaken before each dose. Do not shake dry powder inhalers (DPIs), except Easyhaler which needs to be shaken before use
- For all types of inhalers, it is important to keep the chin tilted slightly up so the medicine reaches the lungs effectively
- For inhalers containing corticosteroids, it is important to rinse the mouth out with water after using the inhaler to remove any residual medicine; this will reduce the likelihood of voice changes and oral thrush
- Remind patients of correct inspiration technique based on inspiratory flow rate
- Turbuhalers, Respimat and pMDI devices should be primed before they are used for the first time
- For inhalers with a dose counter, it is important to check there are sufficient doses remaining in the inhaler before each use
- After each use, wipe the mouthpiece with a clean, dry tissue

- P Device requires **priming** before use
- O Device has a dose counter
- S Device should be **shaken** before use

#### Multidose DPI – reservoir



# **Easyhaler**



- Hold upright with mouthpiece cover at the bottom
- 2. Remove the mouthpiece cover
- 3. Shake up and down 3 to 5 times in the upright position
- Press down once on the coloured button until you hear a click and then release
- **5.** Breathe out slowly and gently, away from inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- Put mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form good seal; do not cover air vents
- 7. Breathe in quickly and deeply
- **8.** Hold breath for about 5 10 seconds or as long as comfortable
- While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- 10. Breathe out gently away from the inhaler
- 11. Replace the mouthpiece cover after use
- **12.** If more than one dose is needed, repeat steps 2 to 11

Inhale quick and deep



#### Genuair



- Remove cap by squeezing arrows and pulling outwards
- **2.** Hold inhaler horizontally so large coloured button is facing straight up
- **3.** Without tilting inhaler, press and release the button
- Check control window has changed to green
- **5.** Breathe out slowly and gently, away from inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- Place mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form a good seal; keep inhaler horizontal
- **7.** Breathe in quickly and deeply; keep breathing in after click is heard
- **8.** Hold breath for about 5 10 seconds or as long as comfortable
- While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- 10. Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- 11. Check control window has changed to red. If it is still green, the inhalation was not strong enough to trigger the dose and steps 5 to 10 need to be repeated
- 12. Replace cap
- 13. If an extra dose is needed<sup>1</sup>, repeat steps 1 to 12

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### **Spiromax**



- Hold inhaler upright with mouthpiece cover at the bottom
- **2.** Open the mouthpiece cover downwards until it clicks
- 3. Breathe out slowly and gently, away from inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- Place mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form a good seal; do not cover air vents
- 5. Breathe in quickly and deeply
- **6.** Hold breath for about 5 10 seconds or as long as comfortable
- While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- 8. Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- 9. Close mouthpiece cover
- **10.** If an extra dose is needed, repeat steps 1 to 9


#### Turbuhaler



- 1. Unscrew and remove cover
- Keep inhaler upright and twist grip at the base around and then back until click is heard
- 3. Breathe out slowly and gently, away from the inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- Place mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form a good seal; do not cover air vents
- 5. Breathe in quickly and deeply
- **6.** Hold breath for about 5 10 seconds or as long as comfortable
- While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- 8. Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- 9. If an extra dose is needed, repeat steps 2 to 9
- Replace cover

### Single dose dry powder inhaler (DPI) - capsule

#### Breezhaler



- 1. Remove cap
- 2. Flip open mouthpiece
- **3.** Remove one capsule from blister and place in chamber
- **4.** Close mouthpiece until it clicks; leave cap open
- **5.** Press side piercing buttons in once and release (do not shake)
- **6.** Breathe out slowly and gently, away from inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- 7. Put mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form good seal
- Breathe in quickly and deeply, you should hear the capsule vibrating inside the inhaler
- **9.** Hold breath for about 5 10 seconds, or as long as comfortable
- **10.** While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- 11. Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- **12.** Open mouthpiece and check capsule is empty; if not, repeat steps 6 to 11
- **13.** Open the mouthpiece and tip used capsule into the bin
- **14.** If more than one dose is needed<sup>¶</sup>, repeat steps 3 to 12
- 15. Close mouthpiece and cap

#### Handihaler



- 1. Open cap
- 2. Flip open mouthpiece
- Remove one capsule from blister and place in chamber
- Close mouthpiece until it clicks; leave cap open
- 5. Press green piercing button in once and release (do not shake)
- **6.** Breathe out slowly and gently, away from inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- Put mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form a good seal
- Breathe in quickly and deeply, you should hear the capsule vibrating inside the inhaler
- Hold breath for 5 10 seconds, or as long as comfortable
- **10.** While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- 11. Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- **12.** Repeat steps 6 to 11 to empty capsule completely
- 13. Open the mouthpiece and tip used capsule into the bin
- 14. Close mouthpiece and cap

# LupinHaler



- Open cap
- 2. Flip open mouthpiece
- **3.** Remove one capsule from blister and place in chamber
- Close mouthpiece until it clicks; leave cap open
- Press piercing button in once and release (do not shake)
- **6.** Breathe out slowly and gently, away from inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- 7. Put mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form a good seal
- Breathe in quickly and deeply, you should hear the capsule vibrating inside the inhaler
- 9. Hold breath for about 5 10 seconds or as long as comfortable
- **10.** While holding breath, remove inhaler from
- 11. Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- **12.** Repeat steps 6 to 11 to empty capsule completely
- 13. Open the mouthpiece and tip used capsule into the bin
- 14. Close mouthpiece and cap

#### Zonda



- 1. Open cap
- 2. Flip open mouthpiece
- Take one capsule from the bottle and place into the chamber
- Close mouthpiece until it clicks; leave cap open
- **5.** Press piercing button in once, and release (do not shake)
- **6.** Hold the inhaler horizontally but don't tip it upside down
- 7. Breathe out slowly and gently, away from inhaler until your lungs feel empty
- Put mouthpiece between teeth without biting and close lips to form a good seal
- **9.** Breathe in quickly and deeply; you should hear the capsule vibrating inside the inhaler
- **10.** Hold breath for about 5 10 seconds, or as long as comfortable
- While holding breath, remove inhaler from mouth
- 12. Breathe out gently, away from inhaler
- 13. Repeat steps 7 to 11 to empty the capsule completely
- **14.** Open the mouthpiece and tip used capsule into the bin
- **15.** Close the mouthpiece and cap
